On March 1, the Supreme Court decided <u>Gobeille v. Liberty</u> <u>Mutual Insurance Co.</u>, holding that ERISA preempted a Vermont law's APCD reporting requirements for self-funded employee health plans (see our case brief <u>here</u>). This case has enormous implications for price transparency and cost containment strategies, especially at the state level.
